



TEACHING-LEARNING SPECIAL FEATURES

LMS under AIMES Portal: During Covid Pandemic, the College introduced Learning Management System (LMS) to provide study materials to the students on and from 30.03.2020. Students Assignments in Short and Broad Answer type are usually given through LMS Portal.

Maximum Teachers have Academic YouTube Channels and they continue uploading lectures so that students can also avail themselves of lectures after classroom teaching.

The College has I-Library, apart from Central Library and Departmental Library which is accessible both to the Teachers and Students.

The College subscribes E-Journal and E-books through N-List which is accessible to all teaching faculties and few Honours Students.

The College introduced Mentor-mentee system from 2018-2019 where on an average 45 students allotted to each teacher. Mentor Mentee system is not only a students' counselling system but further step towards mentoring of the teaching-learning process.

Our Karate Students Won One Gold, Two Silver And One Bronze In Inter College Taekwondo Competition On 11th December 2019 At Netaji Satabarshikimahavidyalaya, Ashok Nagar, North 24pgs.
- The college took initiatives to introduce Yoga and Karate as Skill Enhancement Courses from the academic year 2020-2021 with requisite approval and affiliation from the affiliating University, WBSU.



ASSESSMENT

According to the system of CBCS and the guidelines of the affiliated universities, all the Departments are entitled to take 25 marks continuous assessment process. Projects are allotted to the students as a part of the Continuous Internal Assessment process in SEC subjects and a few core subjects. These Projects are assessed by the concerned Departments. University Examination is the final mode of Assessment.

Continuous Assessment is a part of the CBCS and different departments of our College implemented it through Class Tests, Group discussions, Solo speech and Students' Seminars.

Different Department follows different methods to identify Slow learners through the continuous Assessment process. Slow learners are provided extra study materials or sometimes extra classes are arranged for them. However, special coaching and counselling are provided to slow learners when required.

REVIEW


Academic Subcommittee plays vital role in the academic atmosphere and academic quality enhancement of the college. Besides preparing academic calendar and routine, Academic Subcommittee convenes review meetings after each final examination of each semester where each HOD shared their problems and experiences starting from the completion of syllabus to the examination process to minimize the errors in future through well planned procedures and strategies approved in the meeting.

IQAC convenes Internal Academic Audit to review the Academic quality of each Department and Academic activities of faculties are also evaluated.

Feedback Collected from different Stake holders: Exit feedback collection was started from 2018-19 but there was offline feedback at that time. It was generally collected from the Students. Currently we are collecting feedback online using AIMES Portal and a special module is dedicated for the purpose.



- PROVIDING SCHOLARSHIP'. AT HER REQUEST, IT WAS DECIDED THAT INTEREST ACCUMULATED PER ANNUM FROM THE TOTAL AMOUNT WOULD BE PAID AS A SCHOLARSHIP.
- FROM 2019-2020 SESSION FOR MERITORIOUS STUDENTS OF OUR COLLEGE. AN AMOUNT OF RS 50,000/- HAS BEEN DONATED BY 'PROF. BASUDEV MONDAL, ASST. PROF, DEPT. OF BENGALI FOR THIS PURPOSE.

SPECIAL FEATURES (BRASS FUND & ALFONSO FUND)

- B. R. Ambedkar Social Service Fund has been created to cater the service towards our ex-students and to the society.
 Ex-Students of our colleges having Family Income Less than Rs1, 20, 000/ per annum and families under BPL Category of our 5 adopted villages, Kola, Kumarkhola, Parmadan, Kantakhali and Sagarpur are our beneficiaries.
 Institution has decided that Donation would be given from this fund to the beneficiaries in the case of severe illness/disease which requires prolonged and expensive treatment, Fatal accidents, Repairing of assets/houses damaged by natural calamities'.
 The Fund has already been used for the above mentioned purposes, but the maximum grant was made to the beneficiaries during the Super-Cyclone Umpun in May 2020.
 - > The college maintains a 'Staff Benefit Fund' to which all teaching staff and non-teaching staff contribute their monthly subscription which is regularly deducted from the monthly salary of the staff.
 - > Very recently it has been resolved that working lunch will be provided to the poor and needy students when the department teachers will recommend the name of the student/s to the SBF. The working Lunch is named as 'Ambedkar Lunch Box Fund for Originally Needy Students of Ours' (ALFONSO)

SPECIAL FEATURES (COVID CELL)

- Covid cell was formed on 13th June 2020 in our institution under the convenor Shri Koushik Shaw, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science.
- The cell selected a few student representatives, who were assigned to assist in the online examination of third year students, that was scheduled at that time.
- These students volunteers were known as Covid Warriors. The Covid Warriors were allotted the duties by the cell to teach them the various modalities of the online exam.
- Examinees who wished to submit offline answer scripts to the College, these warriors had to bring the answer scripts from those examinees and submit it to the college. These Covid Warriors were later rewarded by the college for their sincere contribution. "These activities of students is named as "Earn While You Learn".
- Covid cell is still active now to look after the corona prevention measures of the institution, like sanitization, maintaining social distancing among the students. Covid Cell has conducted a Vaccination Camp for the Students of our College.

STUDENTS SUPPORT SYSTEM

<u>Students' Welfare Fund</u>: The College has Students' Aid Fund for the help of the poor students, but this fund is primarily intended for exemption of Tuition Fees. Many students have already availed this facility. However, in 2019-20 and 2021-22, the funds were used to help a poor student Abhijit Sardar (History Honors), boarder of the Government SC Hostel next to the college, by paying half the hostel fees.

<u>Grievance Redressal Cell</u>: We care for Grievances of the Students. Students may write their grievances in a letter to the members of this Cell. However we are feeling proud to mention that not a single grievance has been submitted till date. It implies that a favorable and satisfying environment for Students is prevailing in the college.

Anti-Ragging Cell: Students and staff may complain against any kind of ragging they would face in the college in writing to the members of this cell and dropped in the complaint-box. Though a complaint received from a 2^{nd} Sem student Sahara Mondal, and a mentee of Smt. Srijani Ray on 1/7/2021. An emergency meeting was convened on 2/7/2021. After discussion, it was found that the case comes under the periphery of ICC, not under this Cell. Therefore, the case was referred to ICC for the next course of action.

INNOVATIONS & BEST PRACTICES

The college has Environmental Conservation and Action Committee (ECAC) which take initiatives to maintain the environmental norms and to grow the environmental consciousness among the students and Staff. The slogan of this committee is "Clean College and Green College". Therefore committee takes initiative to transformed the campus green and a plastic free. The committee is conscious to minimize the use of papers and maximum use of LED bulbs. There is a garden of Medicinal plants. Awareness programmes on environment are held regularly.

- College introduced 'The ART OF LIVING' as counselling programmes in collaboration with 'The Art of Living Foundation' and resource persons from this institution are invited to conduct the programmes.

It has also contributed a lot to collect fund from the Local communities, either in cash or kind for the augmentation of college infrastructure

- > Growing number of girls students despite of dropout cases for early marriage. therefore, through various programmes, we get the opportunity to teach them how to hold a strong foothold in society.
- Since the college is situated in a remote area of West Bengal, there is a growing demand for education. It is our opportunity that we are trying our best to cater to the growing demand.
- > Plenty of spaces to carryout social outreach programmes.
- It is our opportunity that local people are helping us in the development process through the CLOC committee of the college.

STRENGTH, WEAKNESS, OPPORTUNITY AND CHALLENGES (SWOC)

OUR CHALLENGES:

- > To minimize the dropout cases and absenteeism.
- The college is situated in a remote area of West Bengal and students belong to poor economic backgrounds. Therefore our students are from vernacular medium. Our students are not very fluent in English.
- Since the college is located far away from Kolkata, the scholars and teachers of renowned universities or colleges of Kolkata are not interested in delivering offline lecture in any seminars or special lectures of our College so far.


